PARTICIPANTS

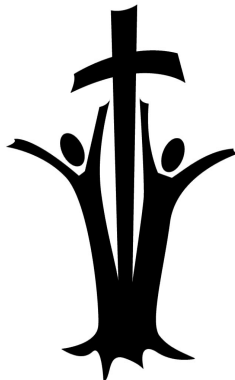
This course is offered at the Academy level and is open to Brethren Academy students (TRIM and EFSM), lay persons and pastors.

OBJECTIVES

The writers of the Bible assume that their audience understood the material world of their time. However, readers today often do not understand the social and material world of antiquity. This course will provide the students an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the world of the Bible.

- the royal and imperial structures of the biblical period.
- the material and cultural expressions of everyday life in the biblical era.
- the religious institutions of the biblical period.
